I would like to express my sincere gratitude for your generous support for student exchange ever since the conclusion of the memorandum of agreement between our universities.

I am writing this letter in order to inform you in advance that our university has decided to renew the organization of the current short-term exchange programs. In brief, starting the academic year 2020-2021, Programs A, C, D and E will be integrated into one big short-term exchange program, while Program B will remain as it is. This change is intended to provide your students with more flexibility in selecting courses based on their individual study-abroad objective as well as a simplified application procedure.

Along with the above reorganization, please note that every applicant to the integrated program will have to submit us a scanned copy of the official score report of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) or that of a designated standardized English proficiency test, if he or she is not a native speaker of Japanese or English. Please also note, there will be no change in the availability of the JASSO scholarship, and the opportunity for your students to attend our Japanese language and culture courses will remain the same.

We will inform you of our new student exchange programs in details in October upon recruitment of exchange students for the academic year 2020-2021. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact us. I appreciate your understanding and support.
